The leaves were punctured along their inner margin and secured with a silken cord to the inside of two venesta boards, which form the book covers. These boards were obtained from empty tea-chests etc., with some being stencilled Tea, Jam, Pork Pies etc. Day (the mechanic) was entrusted with the binding of the volumes, using old harness leather for the backstrip or spine upon which 'Aurora Australis' was stamped, with two penguins as a Trade mark. It is reported that about 100 copies were produced at Cape Royds of which none were sold. The original intention was to name the volume 'Antarctic Ice-Flowers'.
